

Climate Change 2013: the Physical Science Basis

Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change Fifth Assessment Report, Working Group I

Following four landmark reports, in 2007 the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize along with former U.S. Vice President Albert Gore Jr. The award was given for "efforts to build up and disseminate greater knowledge about man-made climate change, and to lay the foundations for the measures that are needed to counteract such change".

On 27 September 2013, the IPCC will release the Summary for Policymakers of the first part of the Fifth Assessment Report, *Climate Change 2013: the Physical Science Basis*, by Working Group I.

Climate Change: the State of the Science is the first event at which the Working Group I Co-chairs will present the findings of the newly approved report to the general public. **We welcome your participation and questions.**

The event will be held in English and streamed live online. Questions in Swedish will also be welcome during the panel discussion.
